Sara Jensen Carr is an Assistant Professor with a joint appointment in the UH Mānoa Schools of Architecture and Public Health. Her teaching areas focus on the connections between landscape and wellness, urban ecology and design.

Sara holds a Master of Architecture from Tulane University, and both a Master of Landscape Architecture and PhD in Environmental Planning from University of California Berkeley, where she was the founding co-editor of GROUND UP Journal. She is a licensed architect and a LEED Accredited Professional. Her research and representational work has been exhibited at San Francisco Planning and Urban Research (SPUR) gallery, the National Building Museum in Washington D.C., and the San Francisco Museum of Modern Art.

Prior to moving to Honolulu, she practiced professionally in New Orleans, LA and the San Francisco Bay Area. She is a former SPUR/Piero N. Patri Urban Design Fellow and recipient of the Herman Miller Scholarship at the annual meeting of the AIA Academy of Architecture for Health. She has also been an invited lecturer and reviewer at Columbia University and taught studio, digital representation, and environmental design courses at University of California Berkeley. She will begin her appointment on December 1, 2014.
