Judith holds landscape architecture degrees from the Technische Universität München (Dipl.Ing. Univ., 1996) and the University of California at Berkeley (M.L.A., 1998). A dual citizen of Germany and the United States, she is a registered landscape architect in Germany. Judith taught at TU Munich for a couple of years and at UC Berkeley for nine years. Prior to coming to the United States in 2003, she headed the Munich office of the Rainer Schmidt Landscape Architecture firm, where she played a lead role in numerous master-planning and realized urban landscape design projects. With her own studio, in which Judith participates in urban/landscape design competitions in Asia and America, she was awarded first prize and the commission to design the new 15-acre "228 National Memorial Park" in Chiayi City, Taiwan—a project that was opened to the public in 2012.

Judith is frequently invited to serve on professional awards juries and has published and lectured widely. Focused on issues of public open space design and urbanism, Judith's creative work in teaching, applied research, and practice examines the role of landscape ecology, process, performance, and production across spatial and temporal scales.
