Clark Llewellyn is a Professor and the former Dean of the School of Architecture (2007-2013) at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa. He received his Bachelor of Architecture from Washington State University with Distinction and Master in Architecture from Harvard University. Clark is a registered architect and maintains his own firm, Llewellyn Architects, since 1978. His firm has been recognized for design excellence in residential, retail and historic preservation.

He has taught at numerous universities and was the founding Director of the Oregon School of Design. Clark served as Director of the School of Architecture at Montana State University from 1995 through 2007 where the School won the NCARB Grand Prize for integrating practice with the academy in 2006. Clark also served on the AIA National Board of Directors representing the Northwest and Pacific Region from 2004 through 2007 and has been on numerous AIA and AIAS Design Award Juries and NAAB Accreditation Teams. In 2011 Clark received his Fellowship in the American Institute of Architects in the field of Education.
